

# COMMUNITY PAYBACK

## Corby – Weeks of Action Partnerships

This project involves working alongside council wardens, Police Community Support Officers (PCSO's) and other partner agencies on the estates to improve the area for local residents. The Corby Central area incorporates Steying Close, the Beanfield Estate, Town Centre and Hazel leys Estates. The Exeter estate runs from Oakley Road to Clovely Court, round on to Burghley Drive & back to Oakley Road incorporating all streets within the 'loop'. The Kingswood Estate is within the parameters of Gainsborough Road up to Dunedin Road, between Sower Leys Road and Colyers Avenue.

Offenders working on Community Payback have been improving the area for local residents by helping to remove and/or over paint graffiti in all areas, cutting back overgrown shrubs and areas that local youths may be using as drinking dens. This will subsequently also increase visibility in the affected areas which helps to reduce criminality and help reduce the fear of crime in the community.
